Career Services Cover Letters, Resume and Interviewing Prep Encourage students to develop their job-seeking and job-keeping skills early, - before their last semester.

Externships or Job Shadowing Students can try out an occupation or two for a short period of time.

Honors program Students may apply after their freshman year as long as they meet the criteria for the program.

Internships Students can get on-the-job training and in some cases credit towards their degree program, or even a stipend.

Intramurals A great way for students to keep in shape and have fun.

Job Fairs Students can explore majors by attending any of the numerous job fairs throughout the year. Freshmen and Sophomores will find out what skills and majors employers are looking for, and Juniors and Seniors can apply for internships or career opportunities.

Leadership Development Students can be involved in the Freshman Leadership Academy and Co-Curricular Opportunities for Leadership Development (COLD) certificates for Levels I, II, & III.

Undergraduate Research & Scholarly Activity Encourage students to search the database for opportunities to get involved in research, even as a Freshman.
